We are writing to notify you of the availability of the Tier 1 Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the High Speed Rail Empire Corridor Program. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) and the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) have prepared this Tier 1 Draft EIS in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 and the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act. The FRA and NYSDOT are using a tiered process, as provided for under NEPA, to complete the environmental review of the program. The Tier 1 Draft EIS is available at www.dot.ny.gov/empire-corridor.

This Tier 1 EIS describes the environmental impacts of proposed system improvement alternatives to intercity passenger rail services along the 463-mile Empire Corridor, connecting Pennsylvania Station in New York City with Niagara Falls Station in Niagara Falls, New York. It addresses broad, corridor-level issues associated with higher speed passenger rail service along Amtrak's Empire Corridor, such as service frequency, service reliability, and trip times, and sets forth a package of follow-on (Tier 2) studies, proposals, and projects. By improving passenger rail service along the corridor, the High Speed Rail Empire Corridor Program will attract additional passengers, increase travel choices, and support economic development, mobility, and environmental sustainability goals. This Tier 1 Draft EIS presents an assessment of the No Build, or "Base" Alternative, and four Build alternatives that would improve maximum authorized speeds west of Schenectady and presents an assessment of the alternatives' social, economic, and environmental effects.

We solicit your comments on the proposed program. Your comments should be as specific as possible and should address either the merits of the proposed program, or the adequacy of the Tier 1 Draft EIS, or both. Please forward your comments to us by **March 24, 2014**. Public input, along with the results of the alternatives evaluation and impact assessment, will be important factors considered in the selection of the chosen transportation options for this program to be presented in the Tier 1 Final EIS.

Six public hearings will be held statewide, at which oral and written comments can be submitted on the Tier 1 Draft EIS, as described in the attached public notice. Written comments on the project and the Draft EIS may also be submitted to David Chan, Project Manager, High Speed Rail Empire Corridor Program, New York State Department of Transportation, 50 Wolf Road, POD #61, Albany, NY 12232. Comments must be submitted in writing, and e-mail comments may be sent to empirecorridor@dot.ny.gov. Comments may also be submitted online at the project website, where the public hearing schedule, the Tier 1 Draft EIS, and a list of repositories where the Tier 1 Draft EIS can also be viewed at www.dot.ny.gov/empire-corridor. All pertinent comments, including those received at the public hearing, will be evaluated before a preferred alternative for the program is identified.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) and the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) are evaluating improvements to intercity passenger rail services along the 463-mile Empire Corridor, connecting Pennsylvania Station in New York City with Niagara Falls in Niagara Falls, New York. Alternatives considered include the Base, or No Build, Alternative, and alternatives to introduce higher passenger train speeds on the Empire Corridor and to improve reliability, travel times, service frequency, and passenger amenities.

Comments on the Draft EIS must either be in writing or can be submitted in oral testimony at statewide public hearings and must be received by March 24, 2014.
