#### GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC CONDUCT DURING TOWN BOARD MEETINGS

- 1. The Supervisor shall preside at the meetings of the Town Board. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor shall be the acting Supervisor. In the event both the Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor are absent, the other members shall designate one of their members to act as temporary chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn.
- 2. Town residents who wish to speak shall fill out a card at the entrances of the meeting room listing their name, contact information, and the subject matter in which they would like to speak. These cards will be collected prior to the beginning of the Town Board meeting and given to the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor in the absence of the Supervisor.
- 3. Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer and then proceed to the lectern and state their name and address. They must limit their remarks on official town business to up to three minutes on a given topic and may not yield any remaining time to another speaker. They must address their remarks to the Board as a body and not to any member thereof and not to other members of the audience in the form of a debate.
- 4. Speakers should present their remarks in a courteous manner and may not make disparaging remarks or personal comments about public officials, town residents, or others. All speakers will observe the commonly accepted rules of courtesy, decorum, dignity, and good taste with no cursing, swearing, clapping, booing, finger pointing, bullying, whispering, or talking that disrupts the proceedings of the business of the Town Board.
- 5. Any speaker who disregards the directives of the presiding officer in enforcing the rules, disturbs the peace at a meeting, makes impertinent or slanderous remarks, or generally conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner shall be barred from further participation and will forfeit any balance of time remaining for their comments.
- 6. After a final warning, if a speaker willfully refuses to step down, the Town Supervisor shall contact the appropriate authorities to remove the speaker from the meeting room and to restore order.
- 7. The Town Supervisor, or in their absence the Deputy Supervisor, shall ensure compliance with these rules.

#### RESOLUTION 121-2023 NOVEMBER 27, 2023

#### RESOLUTION TO APPROVE STREETLIGHT LED CONVERSION

WHEREAS Central Hudson was requested to provide a proposal to convert the remaining non-LED streetlights in Lighting Districts 1 & 2, and;

WHEREAS their proposal, including the deduction of \$2,658.56 for an Energy Efficiency rebate which decreased the cost of the conversion to \$5,670.11, and;

**WHEREAS** such conversion to LEDs should save the Town approximately 16,000 KWH annually, and;

**WHEREAS** 16,000 KWH would reflect an approximate savings of \$3,000 annually, thus providing the Town with about 2 years for payback on the upfront initial investment,

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore authorizes the Town Supervisor sign the agreement with Central Hudson to convert the remaining non-LED streetlights to LED.

Good Evening Jeff,

Apologies on this taking so long to get to you. Please find the attached rate A LED streetlight proposal.

This should save the Town approximately 16,000 kWh annually with more efficient lighting, equating to a savings of approximately \$3,000.00 annually across New Baltimore's two lighting district bills. Although these numbers are approximate, you're looking at about two years for payback on the upfront initial investment.

#### Re: Streetlight LED Conversion

Dear Town of New Baltimore Board Members,

Central Hudson has identified 59 rate A streetlights across your two accounts which may be converted to LED. The total stranded value remaining on these fixtures is \$8,328.67. Central Hudson's Energy Efficiency rebate of \$0.16/kWh shall reduce the cost by \$2,658.56. The total charge to the Town of New Baltimore for the LED conversion is \$5,670.11.

Upon receipt of payment, the Town of New Baltimore and Central Hudson shall enter into an agreement which grants the conversion to begin. Central Hudson expects to complete all field work within 90 business days from the date payment is received. Central Hudson records are expected to be updated within 60 days of field completion.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore will hold a Public Hearing on December 11, 2023 at 6:45 PM at the Town Hall, 3809 County Route 51, Hannacroix, New York to hear those members of the public who wish to be heard regarding proposed Local Law 5 of 2023, a Local Law to establish a new schedule of real property tax exemptions for persons sixty-five (65) years of age or over and persons with disabilities and limited incomes.

#### PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #5 OF 2023

## A LOCAL LAW TO ESTABLISH A NEW SCHEDULE OF REAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR PERSONS SIXTY-FIVE (65) YEARS OF AGE OR OVER AND PESONS WITH DISABILITIES AND LIMITED INCOMES

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore, as follows:

SECTION 1. This Local Law is adopted pursuant to the authority of Real Property Tax §459© and §467. All definitions, terms and conditions of such statute shall apply to this Local Law and are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Local Law #1 of 2023 is HEREBY REPEALED.

SECTION 3. The Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore will follow the Greene County Senior Citizen Tax Exemption and hereby establishs the following sliding scale of property tax exemptions for real property owned by persons sixty-five (65) years of age or over and for real property owned by a person with a disability whose income is limited by such disability, and used as the legal residence of such person, based on the income limits set forth below:

SECTION 4. Any person who qualifies for a property tax exemption as a person with a disability shall not be eligible for a property tax exemption as a person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or over.

SECTION 5. The maximum income limit set forth in Section 3 above shall be offset by medical and prescription drug expenses actually paid which are not reimbursed or paid for by insurance.

SECTION 6. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.
